Donald Gale Watson was born June 24, 1938 to Marvin and Stella (Reeves) Watson in Caledonia, Missouri and passed away June 28, 2019 at his home in St. James, Missouri at the age of eighty-one years.

As a young boy Don grew up near Benton Creek and attended school in St. James, Missouri. He accepted the Lord as his Savior in his early 40's at Calvary Temple Church and then followed in baptism in a local river. November 1955, Don entered the United States Army and served his country faithfully until his Honorable Discharge in November 1958. In his early years, he did enjoy hunting until his wife started trophy hunting and eventually out did him. Spending time with his family is what Don treasured. They made several memories camping at Pomme de Terre Lake and at Land Between the Lakes. He was proud of his family and cherished his time spent with them. Don was also the author of a book called "Rhythm Of The Road". A true story about his life as a young boy. He was eighty years old at the time the book was printed.
