Virginia Elizabeth (Schafer) Dale was born on April 20, 1932 in Jadwin, Missouri to Otto R. and Lela (Ragsdale) Schafer and passed away on November 24, 2020 in Rolla, Missouri at the age of eighty-eight years.

Virginia was united in marriage to Robert "Bob" Dale on August 6, 1955 and together they shared fifty-five years of marriage before his passing on November 12, 2010. Virginia and Bob were blessed with two daughters, Mary and Nancy.

Virginia was a dedicated teacher for thirty-two years; she started her teaching career in a one-room rural school, taught in Bunker for one year and then finished her career in Salem, retiring from Salem R-80 in 1986.
