

## Donald "Don" Lee Floyd

Donald Lee Floyd was born September 3, 1940, in St. Louis, Missouri. He was the son of Ernest and Anna (Lunn) Floyd. Don was raised in the St. Louis area and graduated from Southwest High School. After high school, he enlisted into the Army National Guard and served his country faithfully and honorably for six years.

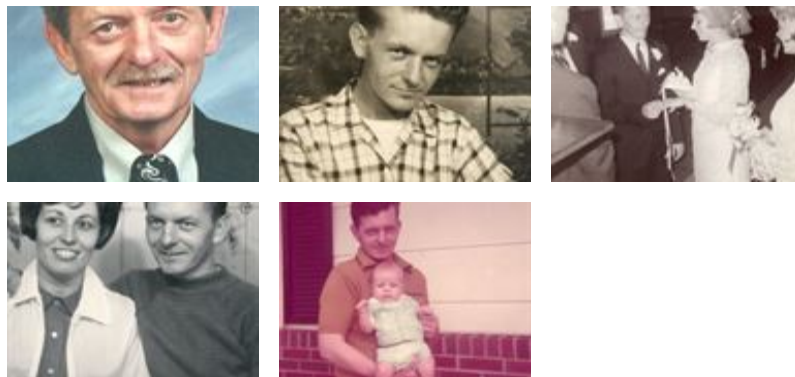
