Doyle David Teague was born on February 25, 1945, in Stone Hill, Missouri. He was one of five children born to William “Willie” Lee and Hattie Louise (Crabtree) Teague. Doyle grew up in Stone Hill and graduated with the class of 1963 from Bunker High School.

He loved music, playing his guitar, and singing.

He valued supporting charities near and dear to his heart such as diabetes and liver cancer research. Doyle was also a member of Sons of the American Legion for twenty-five years.
