Hattie Bell (Dale) Hutchings was born on September 24, 1929, in Wood River, Illinois to Clarence and Laura (Wilkening) Dale and passed away on April 16, 2020, surrounded by her loving family at her home in Salem, Missouri at the age of ninety years.

Hattie grew up Wood River, Illinois and had fond memories of her childhood there. She moved to a farm near the Meramec River with her family when she was a teenager. In order to pursue her dream of getting a High School diploma, Hattie moved to Salem, where she boarded with another family and worked as a waitress. While working, she met the love of her life, Noel Earl Hutchings and on February 14, 1948, Noel and Hattie were united in marriage. Together, they shared sixty years of memories before his passing on September 6, 2005 and were blessed with five children: Roger, Daniel, Brenda, Judith, and Cynthia.

Hattie was a dedicated homemaker devoted to her husband and family. She also worked outside the home in a variety of occupations ranging from tentmaker to Youth Program Associate with the Extension Office to Deputy Circuit Clerk. Her family was very important to her and she cherished the time spent with her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Hattie was always on the go, highly involved with those she loved.

Hattie accepted Christ in her twenties, her relationship and love for Jesus was the most important thing in her life. In the 1960s, she became involved in the ministry as a pastor's wife and served for many years and in many ways. Noel and Hattie served in churches in Missouri and Illinois throughout their ministry. They were servants of God, always visiting and praying for whoever they encountered. Hattie had a passion for missions and a heart for service, she was a member of the First Baptist Church of Salem, her faith was evident to all she encountered.
