



## Warren James DuBois

March 30, 1945 - June 17, 2025

Warren James DuBois was born March 30, 1945, in Brooklyn, New York. He was one of six children born to Warren and Marjorie (Quigley) DuBois. Warren graduated from Xavierian High School in 1962 and went to earn his bachelor's degree from the University of Connecticut.

In 1967, Warren was drafted into the United States Army where he served during the Vietnam War. For his faithful and honorable service, he earned the National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and Vietnam Campaign Medal. His commitment to duty remained a source of pride throughout his life.

On June 27, 1970, Warren was united in marriage to the love of his life, Darlene Faith Robbins. They were blessed with three sons: Warren Joseph, Gregory, and Matthew. Warren and Darlene shared fifty-three lasting years of memories together before her passing in 2023.

Warren had a long and fulfilling career with the United States Forestry Service. After many years of traveling with his forestry crew, whom he considered family, he retired as a district ranger in Salem, Missouri, leaving a legacy of dedication and hard work.

In his retirement, Warren enjoyed staying active and enjoying playing

pickleball and ping pong. He liked spending time outdoors and spent countless hours at Norfolk Lake, where his camper served as a permanent retreat. He found great joy in pontoon boat rides, fishing, pheasant hunting, and elk hunting in Colorado.

A man of generous spirit, he actively volunteered his time at the Armory, assisting with tax preparation through AARP. In 1988, Warren joined the Salem Rotary Club and has served as treasurer for several years, demonstrating his commitment to community service. He was proud of service to his country and Member of the 31st Engineer Battalion Association Group, always looking forward to yearly meetings. A man of faith, he has been an active member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Salem since 1987.

Warren entered into eternal rest June 17, 2025, in Columbia, Missouri, at the age of eighty. He is survived by his loving sons: Warren DuBois and wife Susan of Salem, MO; Greg DuBois and wife Melissa of Rolla, MO, and Matt DuBois and wife Beverly of Clarksville, TN; siblings: Nancy Kellogg, Donald DuBois and wife Lynn, Isabella Buckley, Mary Jude Franke, and Gerard DuBois; grandchildren: Triston, Paige, Reagan, Kaiden, Syllis, Krielle, Kaylie, Kelsie, and Kinsley; great-grandchildren: Addi and Ellie; as well as several nieces, nephews, other relatives, and dear friends.

Preceding him in death were his loving wife: Darlene DuBois; and parents: Warren and Marjorie (Quigley) DuBois.

A man of service, faith, and family, Warren will be deeply missed by all who knew him. He was a delightful man, known for his intelligence and kindness. His memory will live on in the hearts of those he touched.

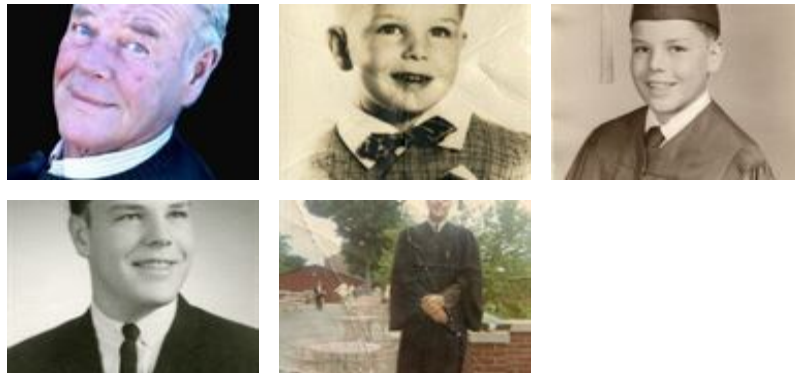
